

## **Review of 2019/20 and intended spending of funding for 2020/21**

Pupil Premium is funding that is allocated to schools from the Government on the basis of children on roll who are known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), or who have been entitled to them, within the past 6 years. It is also allocated to children who have been adopted or looked after (LA) and to children whose parents are members of the Armed Forces. The funding is intended to narrow the attainment gap between PP children and their peers (non- PP). All schools are required to report on the amount of funding received and how it has been used.

### **Principles**

At Pocklington Junior School, our staff strive to achieve the very best outcomes that they can for every child through quality first teaching. We invest in high quality training for all staff and a rigorous monitoring procedure to ensure that teaching and learning is of a consistently high quality for everyone. We recognize that not every child receiving PPG is socially disadvantaged and also that not every child who is disadvantaged receives PPG. By focusing on children's individual needs, we aim to enable every child to achieve and make the best progress that they can. Whilst maintaining a careful track of all pupils' progress, we also closely track how well PPG children are achieving in comparison to their peers (non-PP).

### **Barriers to learning**

- **In reading, 25% of children enter the school below the national expected standard.**
- **In writing, 31% of children enter the school below the national expected standard.**
- **In maths, 24% of children enter the school below the national expected standard.**
- **Disengagement with the school and its systems.**
- **Lack of support from home with reading and the learning of spellings and times table facts.**
- **Lack of cultural capital.**
- **Lack of reading literature and writing equipment at home.**
- **Poor ability to communicate through both speech and writing due to a lack of understanding of language together with poor oracy, vocabulary, phonic and spelling knowledge.**
- **Autistic behaviours.**
- **Poor working memory and processing speeds.**
- **Lack of stability and routine at home.**
- **Lack of aspiration.**
- **Social, emotional and mental health issues with children and/or parents.**
- **Poor attendance.**
